Leadership Retreat

n March 10, 2018, the first South West St. Andrew Constituency Leadership Retreat was held in St. Ann. The following groups of persons were invited to the retreat: all members of the Constituency Committee, two leaders recommended by each Councillor and persons recommended by the M.P.

Among the topics discussed were the way forward, a review of the approaches being used to determine what was working and where changes might be needed; in particular where we need to focus. The retreat had participants expressing their expectations, developing their personal action plans and outlining various channels/means of communication with the wider constituents. A plan of action for political education, groups and enumeration was presented and discussed.

The participants prioritized some development goals which were: education and training, employment, infrastructure development, safe communities, improving the quality of life through better health and education and sports. Among the mandates from the retreat were: regular leadership meetings, group leaders and leadership political education and training, cleaning up of the group lists and an effective communication which enables the wider constituents to know what we do and why.

Leadership Meeting

Following our Leadership retreat we have begun to host Leadership meetings every other month on the second Thursday. These meetings are geared at keeping leaders in the loop in terms of political and constituency plans and programs and allow for feedback from our leaders. The attendance at these meetings has been encouraging and we say thank you to our leaders for supporting this initiative.

Community Engagement

he Member of Parliament remains committed to fulfilling her campaign promise of walking the communities to build a more intimate relationship with residents and a betetr understanding of the issues facing them. Unfortunately much of the engagement is centered around the impact of crime and violence in the community and their negative effect on almost all other aspects of community life. So far the following has been accomplished:

- During the month of November as a part of the MP Thank You Tour she toured several communities
- The MP along with Cllr. Kelly and the police walked in the Whitfield Town Division (Glen Rd. Pretoria Rd,). The M.P & Councillor also visited Maxfield Ave, Freeman Lane, Bowen Rd, Kidd Lane, Rodney Rd & Alexander Rd visiting families and residents in the areas affected by crime as well as the fire victims.
- The MP along with Cllr. Karl Blake and the police had a peace walk in Majesty Gardens to visit some of the families who were affected by crime and violence. In addition the MP and Councillor have visited Union Gardens, Greenwich Town, White Wing & York Ave and discussed the need for a safe community to facilitate community development.
- Spot meetings were also held in the Payne Land Division as well as visits to Mongoose Town, Mckoy Lane, Myrie Ave and Tavares Gardens. The MP along with Councillor Audrey Smith Facey and the police have also jointly facilitated community meetings to discuss a issues relating to crime and violence.
- As part of our Constituency day walk the MP visited the following areas, Palm Grove Housing Scheme, Oakglades Housing Scheme, Crescent Road, Maxfield Ave.
- The MP along with some members of the Delacree Park Citizens Association toured the scheme inclusive of the children's Park. She also met with the Majesty Gardens CDCand members of the Greater Whitfield CDC to discuss working together for the development of the community.
- The MP's walk program also includes meeting with the business community, schools and other stakeholders, so far we have met with and toured the Kingston Wharves and the entire Port Area as well as other businesses in the Constituency. The work continues.

Christmas Work Programme

he Member of Parliament, Councillors and the Executive members agreed to the Christmas Work Programme that included all three division. This was funded through the allocation from the Member of Parliament as well as the Councillors. Consultations were held with the Cluster Managers, Executive Members and Party Coordinators from each Division and the activities, locations, rate of payment, recommendations of beneficiaries and an accountability framework was agreed on. The programme focused on clean-up of communities. In the debriefing session, persons indicated that was a general sense that actual work was done and impact seen. The arrangements for payment were done on a Divisional basis and to the satisfaction of the workers.

There were 31 teams in Greenwich, 27 in Whitfield and 35 in Payne Land, a total of 93 teams with temporary employment for approximately 1,000 persons

TREATS FOR THE ELDERLY AND SHUT-INS were held separately in each Division in December, 2017:

- I. Payne Land on December 22, at 2:00 p.m. at the Haile Selassie High School
- II. Greenwich Town on December 23, at 12:00 noon at the Caribbean Palms Community Center
